Using Canva for your infographic:

To find the template, go to Canva.com then click "Find templates" then go to the white column on the left hand side of the screen. It lists all the template options in alphabetical order. Go to "infographic" and click "all" and then choose a template that fits your preference, information, and your preference. REMEMBER, Canva lets you change out pictures, lines, text, etc. Just spend a few minutes exploring the create tools.

Before attempting to input information on your infographic I suggest that you:

- 1) have all your information in a Word document
- 2) then list that information in priorities from 1 as most important and then on down
- 3) likely the information that is at the top of the list will be in the biggest font
- 4) if something at the bottom of your list ends up not fitting then it is probably not important enough to include. If you decide it is, then you will have to figure out how to add it (including the possibility of removing something else)
- 5) remember, an infographic is a creative snapshot of a major issue. What are the basic stats of your housing type, what are the issues they face, how is it connected to race, etc.
- 6) Include your references in **ASA format** at the end of the infographic (small font is fine)
- 7) I've included below some examples of good and bad infographics
